
Thank you for your email of March 4, 2009, and for the continued opportunity that you and your staff have afforded EMC to address your questions and resolve your concerns. I join with Mark Lewis in extending my assurance that EMC is committed to your success.

The EMC technical team conducted an onsite review and audit of the current EOP EmailXtender (EX) deployment during the week of February 9th, 2009, and certified that the solution design document and configurations delivered to date were prepared and delivered using EMC Best Practices. Specifically, the EX 4.81.655 system that was designed, installed, and implemented by EMC at the EOP, is functioning, and accurately archiving the EOP's unclassified electronic mail from MS Exchange 2000 that is delivered to the EX system, as expected and specified in the contract statement of work.

EMC's support for Microsoft Exchange 2007 was added to our EmailXtender 4.8 SP1 release in August 2007. EmailXtender 4.81.409, 4.81.564, and 4.81.655 (the build deployed at EOP) are all supported build numbers. I stand behind the certification made by Mark Lewis to you on March 4, 2009. EOP can proceed with the Microsoft Exchange 2007 integration with EmailXtender using the same 4.81.655 build. As partners to the EOP, EMC will work closely with the EOP team to respond to and implement the challenge posed by the accelerated Exchange 2007 rollout.

I trust that this letter is responsive to your concerns and that the EX configurations deployed satisfy the Government's requirement. If there is anything further that my team can do to assist, please do not hesitate to contact us.
